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#### **ABSTRACT**

Chairunnisa Kairupan (1444H / 2023M): Slang Words Used By The Students' Live Streaming Through Hallo Application. A thesis of English Education Study Program, Faculty of Tarbiyah and Teacher Training, Manado State Institute of Islamic Studies.

This research aims to identify the types and dominant types of slang words used by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo Application. Descriptive qualitative was employed on this research. To gather the data, the researcher utilized thr observation and questionnaire as the instruments. The respondents were 60 indonesian advance level students who often applied live streaming through Hallo application. In the meantime, the researcher used Miles and Huberman theory to analyzed the data which collected through data reduction, data display and conclusion. The results of this research show 29 data of slang words were found based on Allan and Burridge theory. The researcher found 11 imitative, 6 acronym, 4 fresh and creative, 4 flippant, and 4 clipping. Meanwhile, the dominant type of slang words is the imitative type that has score 34% as the highest slang found. It followed by fresh and creative type with score 24%. Then, the acronym type with score 22 %. After that, the clipping type with score 12%. Last, are the flippant type with score 8%. In conclusion, Imitative type is the dominant type of slang words based on the frequency of slang words usage.

#### **ABSTRAK**

Chairunnisa Kairupan (1444H / 2023M): Kata Slang Digunakan Live Streaming Siswa Melalui Aplikasi Hallo. Skripsi dari Program Studi Tadris Bahasa Inggris, Fakultas Tarbiyah dan Ilmu Keguruan, Institut Agama Islam Negeri Manado.

Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengidentifikasi jenis dan jenis kata *slang* yang dominan digunakan siswa Indonesia tingkat mahir dalam *live streaming* melalui Aplikasi Hallo. Penelitian ini menerapkan metode kualitatif deskriptif. Untuk mengumpulkan data, peneliti menggunakan Observasi dan Kuesioner sebagai instrumen. Responden penelitiannya adalah 60 siswa Indonesia tingkat mahir yang sering melakukan *live streaming* melalui aplikasi Hallo. Peneliti menggunakan teori Miles dan Huberman untuk menganalisis data yang berisi pengurangan data, tampilan data, dan kesimpulan. Hasil penelitian ini menunjukkan 29 data kata *slang* ditemukan berdasarkan teori Allan dan Burridge. Peneliti menemukan 11 imitatif, 6 akronim, 4 *fresh* dan kreatif, 4 *flippant*, dan 4 kliping. Sementara itu, jenis kata *slang* yang dominan adalah tipe imitatif yang memiliki skor 34% sebagai slang tertinggi yang ditemukan. Ini diikuti oleh jenis *fresh* dan kreatif dengan skor 24%. Kemudian, jenis akronim dengan skor 22%. Setelah itu, tipe kliping dengan skor 12%. Terakhir, adalah tipe *flippant* dengan skor 8%. Kesimpulannya, tipe Imitatif adalah tipe kata *slang* yang dominan berdasarkan frekuensi penggunaan kata *slang*.

#### **CHAPTER I**

#### INTRODUCTION

#### A. Background of Study

Language is considered the most important means of conveying information. Language is an important aspect of human life because it allows people to easily communicate with each other. Human language evolves and changes over time as a result of various factors such as social life and the human need for language. On this case, Allah SWT has explained us about languages in Al-Qur'an Surah Ar-Rum in 22th verse:

Translation:

"And of His signs is the creation of the heavens and the earth, and the diversity of your languages and colors. In this are signs for those who know.(22)" (Q.S Ar-Rum 30:22)<sup>1</sup>

The interpretation of Ibnu Katsir from the qur'an verse explained that The Almighty indicates His magnificent power by All of His creatures of the heaven and the earth such as stars, mountains and trees. On the other hand, Only Allah knows the variety of languages spoken among the sons of Adam.<sup>2</sup>

From the interpretation above, Allah created the heavens and the earth, as well as man from various types of people. Every human being has the opportunity to communicate in a variety of ways, despite differences

such as language style, accent, and dialect. The variety of languages spoken by each race is a sign of His greatness, making them all equal in His eyes.

It can be concluded language allows people to understand and comprehend what the speaker is saying. Language has many variations in society and is used by many people throughout the world as a tool to communicate each other within a group

The branch of knowledge that examines the language in general or based on the structure of the language is called Linguistics However, Sociolinguistics is one of the branches of linguistics. Fromkin stated sociolinguistics is concerned with studying the relationship between language and society in order to gain a better understanding of the structure of language and how it functions in communication. It is clear that language and society are relating to each other. In addition, people usually choose a language variety that they want to show intimacy in their group.

One of the study in Sociolinguistic is Slang. Slang is a language in society that people use to communicate with their social group. Slang is distinct from general language; this language is only understood by members of a specific group. It is supported by Eble that stated slang is the informal language words and phrases that speakers use to establish or enforce social identity or cohesiveness within a group or with a trend and fashion in society itself.<sup>4</sup>

These words are mostly speech and written form. People can see person's dialect through slang in both formal and informal communication. It clearly demonstrates how slang can see a person's cultures, habits, profesies, or way of life in the community. It means that slang words can be use to determine someone's identity.<sup>5</sup>

Since social media has effectively expanded the emerging new slang language, it is unsurprising that slang is also used as a social language on social media. Slang has become popular among people and one factor that has contributed to its spread is social media. It is because using social media has become a new culture for people nowadays, where they might join groups with similar hobbies, interests, work, and so on.<sup>6</sup>

Nowadays, the widespread accessed to technology and the internet as well as the popularity of social media allows people to use live streaming for their personal use, sharing of information, communication, and many more. Live streaming features are widely available on some up-to-date social media, such as Facebook, Instagram, Tiktok, Twitch etc. In this case, the researcher uses the Hallo Application as the object of this study.

Hallo is a social live streaming app for learning English. Users can start a real-time conversation with a speaking partner via video chat and watch live English lessons from native speakers. By streaming live on the Internet, the user can connect with people and collaborate while also experiencing events as they happen in real-time.<sup>7</sup>

The phenomenon of slang word usage on livestreaming was discovered by the researcher on this platform. When a livestreamer shares useful information, some viewers react by using slang words. For instance, Anw, I gotta go and Nice info, dude/bro.

In this research, the researcher is interested to use Hallo App as a tool of conducting slang words. Hallo App has a useful feature in which users can create an live streaming freely and easily to communicate each other. Throughout this application, people usually communicate using a variety of language styles, including slang words.

Related to the previous explanation above, the researcher is interested in conducting the research about slang words used by the Students' Live streaming through Hallo App.

#### **B.** Research Question

- 1. What are the types of slang words used by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo Application?
- 2. What is the dominant type of slang word used by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo Application?

#### C. Research Objectives

Based on the research questions, This research aims:

- 1. To identify the types of slang words produced by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo Application
- 2. To find the dominant type of slang words that used by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo Application

#### D. Limitation of The Research

The study focused on the types of slang words students use and discover the dominant types of slang words on the live streaming of indonesian advance level students through the Hallo application.

#### E. Significance of the Research

The result of this study is expected to be contributes as follows:

#### 1. Theoritically

The findings of this study can add to our insight of the theory of slang words and help us further our research in this area.

#### 2. Practically

- a. For Lecturer, This study can be used as a reference for lecturer who would like to make learning more enjoyable by using slang words.
- b. For Teacher, This study can be used to expand teacher's knowledge of language variety, particularly slang words, so that the teacher can share it with students.

c. For Student, This study are expected to be useful for students who need to conduct future research in the sociolinguistic field, such as slang words and helps students to learn a new language through this platform.

#### F. Definition of Key Terms

#### 1. Slang

Hornby as citied in Rezeki and Sagala states slang refers to words, phrases, and word meanings that are commonly used in conversation among friends or colleagues but are not appropriate for good writing or formal occasions. Slang is language (words, phrases, and usages) of an informal register used by members of specific groups such as teenagers, musicians, and criminals to establish group identity.<sup>8</sup>

#### 2. Hallo Application

According to Daso, Hallo is a live streaming learning platform for non-native speakers. Native English speakers host live streams via their startup's smartphone application to teach English and allow learners from all over the world to experience cultural immersion. These live streams involve multiple users listening to a native English teacher at the same time. The community that develops as a result of users interacting with one another while learning from a teacher creates more opportunities for practice. This type of digital gathering can be used as a retention tool to keep users on the platform.<sup>9</sup>

#### 3. Live Streaming

Netrawati et al stated Live streaming video is an important medium for communication that combines audio and visual elements. Live

#### **CHAPTER II**

#### REVIEW OF LITERATURE

#### A. The Field of Sociolinguistic

#### 1. Definition of Sociolinguistic

The term sociolinguistics is composed of two words: socio and linguist. "socio" refers to a group of people who live in a specific location or society, and "linguist" refers to languages. According to Mayerhoff, Sociolinguistics is a broad field that includes many different ways of studying language. Also Mayerhoff explains how people enable to modify the way they speak depending on who they are with or what the situation is.<sup>1</sup>

Trudgill defines sociolinguistics as "the branch of linguistics concerned with language as a social and cultural phenomenon." It means a branch of linguistics that studies the use of language in society. Initially, sociolinguistics was known as the sociology of language or language in society.<sup>2</sup>

According to Spolky, Sociolinguistics is the study of the relationship between language and society, the use of language and the social structures in which language users live. This study assumes that human society is made up of many related patterns and behaviors that involve language. The intricate relationships that exist between variations within a language and the corresponding variations in the social groups that use it.<sup>3</sup>

Referring to Wardhaugh, Sociolinguistics studies the relationships between language and speciety to gain a better understanding of the structure of language and how languages function in communication.

Sociolinguistics is a field of study about society and their language used which exerts influence on linguistic structures, this study is concerned about

several factors that influence linguistic structure. For example, age differences (children and adults speak differently), gender differences (women are more polite than men when speaking), regional differences (every region has its own way of using language), and so on<sup>4</sup>.

Sociolinguists study the interaction of language and society. They curious about why we speak differently in different social contexts, and they expect to know what the social functions of language are and how it is used to convey social meaning.<sup>5</sup>

Since language represents to convey messages, there must be social interactions among community members. These social interactions can reveal information about the people involved's relationships. Thus, sociolinguistics is relevant in understanding how members of society interact with one another.

#### 2. Language Variation

Hudson defines variety of language as a group of linguistic items with similar social distribution. Ferguson defined language variation as any speech pattern that is sufficiently homogeneous to be analyzed by available synchronic description techniques and that has a large enough repertory of elements and their arrangement or process with a broad enough semantic scope to function in all normal communication contexts.<sup>6</sup>

Everyone speaks at least one language, and most people apparently speak more than one. Even most Americans, who only speak English, are familiar with multiple dialects. No one speaks in the same way all of the time. Men do not speak like women, and older people do not speak like

younger people, as a result of the use of a single language that is different within a single community.

#### a. Dialect

A dialect is defined by variations in grammar, vocabulary, and sound. For example, if one person says, 'John is a farmer,' and another says the same thing but pronounces farmer as 'fahmuh,' the difference is one of accent. However, if one person says, 'You should not do that,' and another says, 'Ya hadn't oughta do that,' this is a dialect difference because the difference is greater. Linguists define dialect as the collection of attributes (phonetics, phonology, syntactic, morphological, and semantic) that distinguish one group of speakers from another group of speakers of the same language.<sup>7</sup>

So, dialect is a user-related variation. Differences in pronunciation, vocabulary, and grammar are all involved

#### b. Accent

Montgomery defines accent as "the entire patterns of pronunciation characteristic of a particular region or social group." An accent is a way of pronouncing a language in sociolinguistics. It is a unique way of pronouncing the name of a person, place, or country. An accent can identify the location of its speakers, their socioeconomic status, ethnicity, caste or social class, first language (when speaking a second language imperfectly), and so on.8

An accent is the distinctive way that speech is pronounced by a group of people who speak the same language

#### c. Register

Wardhaugh defines registers as collections of language items associated with a specific occupational or social group. People can express their identity at a specific time or place by using a register.<sup>9</sup>

In other words, each register is unique, and each group may develop distinct vocabularies.

#### d. Jargon

The use of specific words is implied by jargon. Jargon, on the other hand, refers to the specialized vocabulary that characterizes the language use of various groups of people, frequently occupational or recreational groups (for example, medical jargon or law/legal jargon). <sup>10</sup>

Jargon, unlike slang, is not limited to situations of extreme informality and generally lacks the rebellious undertones associated with the use of slang expressions.

#### e. Slang

Widarso defines slang as "non-standard words known and used by a specific group of people," such as a group of teenagers, a group of college students, a group of jazz musicians, and so on. 11

In the other hand, slang is a type of language composed of words and phrases that are considered very informal, are more common in speech than writing, and are typically limited to a specific context or group of people.

#### **B.** The Concept of Slang Words

1. Definition of Slang Words

Slang is a very informal word that is used by a specific group of people and has its own meaning. Several definitions of slang words can be found below:

According to Swan, is a very informal type of vocabulary that is mostly used in speech by people that know each other well. On the other hand, This language was chosen for its striking informality and is consciously used during preference to proper speech. Almost everyone uses slang on occasion, but the term is difficult to define.<sup>12</sup>

Jargon and slang are commonly used synonymously. Jargon is specialized vocabulary used by people within established social groups, whereas slang is more commonly used by people outside of established higher-status groups. Slang, also known as "colloquial speech," refers to words or phrases that are used instead of more common terms by younger speakers and other groups with specific interests. <sup>13</sup>

It can be used by members of a group who share attitudes and opinions to distinguish themselves from others. Slang expressions can 'grow old' quickly as a marker of group identity during a limited stage of life, such as early adolescence. The difference in slang use between groups of older and younger speakers demonstrates that age is another important factor in social variation.<sup>14</sup>

Based on the definition above, slang words is an informal language, so they are not yet widely accepted and fully understood by all people because they are mostly used by young people.

#### 2. History of Slang words.

Slang first appears in the sixteenth century. Slang was commonly used at the time to change the inelegant statement of being associated

with a foreigner or a criminal, some people use it to make a joke and keep the secret of the word's meaning, and some people want to express their ideas using a language other than Standard English. For example, *Patricos* means Strolling, *Doxies* means Beggar's trulls, *Priggers* means Thieves

Then, in the seventeenth century, slang became rich in figurative language and associated with immoral action, for example, *Clap* means Clatter, *Crimp* means A Card Game, etc. In the Eighteenth Century, People who aren't criminals begin to use slang in comedy. For example, *Melt* means To Spend and Whiter-Go-Ye means *A Wife*.

In the nineteenth century, slang words expanded and were widely used in social interactions. For example, *Bus* means A Public Carriage and *Burra* means A Great Man. After that, Slang became a part of spoken language not only for criminals but also for ordinary people in their daily lives during the twentieth century. Tanked, for example, means Drunk, Cherro, for Classy, and Birdcage, for A Person. <sup>15</sup>

It can be concluded slang is changing and evolving. While slang was only used by criminals in the sixteenth century, it became popular in the eighteenth century. This means that, year after year, not only criminals but also ordinary people use slang in their daily activities.

#### 3. The Classification of Slang Words

Patridge classify the slang words, which are as follows:

#### a. Cockney Slang

Cockney slang is a dialect of English that originated in England's End East. First and foremost, Cockney slang is spoken by the working class in England. However, at the moment, all of these people are saying in this language. The majority of cockney slang

can be found in music, film, and literature. For example *Back Double* means a back street.<sup>16</sup>

#### b. Public House Slang

Public house refers a group of words or phrases used in public places that can compensate for lack of recorded vocabulary. This slang is mild, pleasant, and materialistic, rather than vulgar or cynical. This slang is also heard in every home in the United States and England. These words will occur spontaneously without being noticed by the owners, especially in the natural way. A public house is occasionally used in films, literary works, etc. For example *Booze-Shunter* means a beer drinker.<sup>17</sup>

#### c. Workmen's Slang

Although there is some overlap between workmen's slang and public house slang, there are significant differences between the two. Users did not refer to the actual "something" in workmen's slang; instead, they referred to it by another name that they were familiar with. Nonetheless, this slang term is not a common way to express the occasion. Workmen's slang is in the plural form because it is used collectively by the workmen. For example Jumping Jinny means a mechanical stamper used in road-repairs.<sup>18</sup>

#### d. Trademen's Slang

The user of this slang language is also a worker, and some of the words are related to the original slang. However, there is a distinction between distinguishing this slang and another distinguishing slang. There are four types of tradesman slang: tailor, butcher, chemist, and builder.

- Trademen's Slang for Tailor is House of Parliament means tailor's assistants and apprentices who meet in the shop, especially for serious reason.
- 2) Trademen's Slang for Butcher is *Turkey Buyer* means a person of considerable important
- 3) Trademen's Slang for Chemist is *Tamarinds* means this word accurately describes the nature of the chemist's trade.
- 4) Trademen's Slang for Builder is *Flannel Jacket*, which means that navy ships participating in heavy work have long flannel, so flannel wear is unrivaled.<sup>19</sup>

#### e. Slang in Art

Although only a few words are referred to as "art language," words or phrases in slang art have been accepted by society. Furthermore, this slang is much more difficult to learn than other slang terms. Its meaning is difficult to interpret today. The adaptation from the person who is doing everything related to art and other things that consider what is going to replenish the meaning from the source language into the target language. For example *Drawing* means a picture in water-color.<sup>20</sup>

#### f. Slang in Publicity

Since many modern businesses rely on propaganda, most people are beginning to use this language, and businesses require appealing phrases or rhymes that will impress the public. For example *Worth a guinea a box* means a small, cheap, yet goog or useful article.<sup>21</sup>

#### g. Slang in Theatre

This slang is well-known for its theatrical applications, as indicated by its name. It is only used on stage when we see actors and actresses perform their acting skills in front of a large audience who prefers to watch the show based on what they want to perform on many occasions. For example *An Acting Lady* which refers to an incapable actress.<sup>22</sup>

#### h. Slang in Public School

The most common type of slang used by students. Students, as we all know, are young, vibrant, and full of creativity. Every school has its own unique set of words that no other school has. This slang is also derived from the creativity of the youth, and the students are regarded as young and fresh talented young ages as a result. The terms that come from their thoughts may hold the key to reincarnating this as we want to hear it from them, so that we can finally figure it out as one of the best things ever created to define the meaning itself. For example *Bung* means A lie.<sup>23</sup>

#### i. Society Slang or Internet Slang

Society slang is frequently used in everyday spoken language and is associated with society. Every social group has its own slang, and these words or phrases become the group's property through association. Slang language has become such a defining feature of many groups in the modern world that it is impossible to ignore its influence on Western society. Internet slang (also known as shorthand-speak, netspeak, or chat-speak) refers to various types of slang used by various people on the internet. Internet and social slang are commonly used in daily speaking or texting and are

socially connected here. For example *Silver Pheasant* means A Beautiful Society Woman.<sup>24</sup>

#### j. Slang in Medicine

Slang in medicine refers to the slang language spoken by doctors and nurses. It's difficult to find examples of this slang language because doctors rarely talk to other doctors instead of "shopping" with them and using a famous medical slang language authority to say it. For example *Sciatic* means a sciatic nerve.<sup>25</sup>

#### k. Soldier's Slang

Soldier slang is military slang that is commonly used by soldiers. This slang language is distinguished by the abbreviation/abbreviation or derivative form of NATO phonetic letters, or by the presence of formal military terms and concepts. For example *BOHICA* stands for bend over here it comes again. This is an acronym slang term that became popular among the United States armed forces during the Vietnam War.<sup>26</sup>

#### 4. The Function of Slang

According to Allan and Burridge in Saputra, Slang provides seven functions: to address, to create an intimate atmosphere, to initiate a relaxed conversation, to express impression, to reveal anger, to humiliate, and to demonstrate intimacy.

#### a. To address

To maintain their close relationship, the speaker addresses another speaker with a slang term. People with close relationships prefer informal addresses over formal ones.

#### b. To create an intimate atmosphere

Speakers use ]l'his slang to reduce social distance and make conversation with strangers more comfortable. Slang can be an alternative way to ease the relationship between strangers, allowing them to reduce social distance and become more comfortable.

#### c. To intiate relaxed conversation

People tend to use slang words to initiate a relaxed conversation to ensure a smooth conversation in a formal situation. People close to each other tend to use certain words to make the conversation more relaxed and comfortable.

#### d. To express impression

People typically use slang words to express their thoughts. When the speaker uses a slang term, he wants the listener to remember and be impressed by their conversation. The use of slang creates a sense of group intimacy and solidarity.

#### e. To reveal anger

People use slang to express their anger with something or someone by cursing them.

#### f. To humiliate

People sometimes use slang to mock other people to express how they feel about them.

#### g. To demonstrate intimacy

People prefer nonstandard vocabulary to standard vocabulary. They use slang to show intimacy because it is an effective way of expressing intimacy among conversational speakers. It is more commonly used for people who have a close relationships with others than for people who have distant relationships.<sup>27</sup>

#### 5. The types of slang

According to Allan and Burridge, there are five types of slang: fresh and creative, flippant, imitative, acronyms, and clipping.<sup>28</sup>

#### a. Fresh and creative

This slang has completely new vocabulary, informal variety, ingenuity, creativeness, and it can also be current words. It means that slang words have developed new vocabularies to describe something in an informal way. For example, *Mom* to call Mother and *Daddy* to call Father.<sup>29</sup>

#### b. Flippant

Flippant means that slang language contains irrelevant words from different contexts. This type of word is composed of two or more words that combine to form a new meaning that differs from the literal meaning of the words that forms it. For example, *Break a leg* it means good luck.<sup>30</sup>

#### c. Imitative

Imitative slang is slang that imitates or derives from Standard English (SE) words, using Standard English (SE) words in different contexts, or combines two different words. This type of slang consists of words that have previously existed, but their meaning has expanded and has been quite different from the original. For example, *Gotta* is derived from the phrase "got to." The meaning is similar with the word should or must.<sup>31</sup>

#### d. Acronyms

An acronym is a word formed by combining the first letters of several words. It means that the result of the word is derived from the first letter of each word in a phrase or from using the initials of a group of words or syllables and uttering them as a new word. For example, *ASAP* stand for As Soon As Possible, *OMG* stand for Oh My God, and *BTW* stand for By The Way.<sup>32</sup>

#### e. Clipping

Clipping type are shorter versions of longer words that have the same meaning It means that a slang word is formed by removing a portion of a longer word, resulting in a shorter form with the same meaning. For example, *Feelin* ' is a short form of the word Feeling<sup>33</sup>.

#### C. The Concept of Hallo Application

#### 1. The Definition of Hallo Application

Hallo is a live streaming community for English learners and teachers. People can watch live videos from native speakers everyday and practice speaking English in real time via video chat. It began as a Facebook group with the goal of democratizing English language learning for people around the world who did not have access to quality instruction or Native Speakers.

An application with over 25,000 users was created, and the web-based teaching platform went live in 2021. Hallo students are adults from Indonesia, India, Turkey, Egypt, and Brazil who want to improve their English in order to get better jobs or study abroad. The majority of users of this application are between the ages of 18-30. This application has differentiated students at a certain level, including beginner, intermediate, advanced, and superior. Using the CEFR to divide

students at certain levels, Hallo separates the students into beginners (A1/A2), intermediate (B1/B2), and advance (C1/C2).<sup>34</sup>

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is an international language ability standard. It assigns a sixpoint scale to language ability, ranging from A1 for beginners to C2 for those who have mastered a language. This allows anyone involved in language teaching and testing, such as teachers or students, to quickly determine the level of various qualifications.<sup>35</sup>

In conclusion, Hallo is a language learning application that helps the users to improve their English for certain purpose. This apps suitable for the person who interesting in improve their speaking skills.

#### 2. History of Hallo Application

Joon and Benjamin Dent launched Hallo, a social application and marketplace for English learning in 2017. Users can have real-time video chat conversations with a practice partner with the click of a button. The next version of the app will enable native speakers to earn money through live streaming and private/group lessons. Hallo began their business in the Facebook community and doubled their Facebook following every month in 2018, bringing their audience to 180,000. They are currently growing by 4,000 followers per week with no advertising.

Eventually, Joon and his partners, Benjamin Dent and Mike Curtis, launched their Beta application product. Over the course of four months, Hallo tested with 10,000 users and logged over 700,000 minutes of video calls—an average of more than 50,000 call minutes per week. On April 29th, Hallo will officially launch both Android and iOS apps, and all 180,000 followers will be invited to begin using the Hallo app. With

Hallo is the market's first real-time language-learning social platform. Hallo connects English learners by assisting them in improving their social speaking skills, which are arguably the most important aspects of language learning.

#### 3. The Function of Hallo Application

The Function of this application is helps its users in becoming proficient in English by providing a variety of features that can acquaint users with daily English. For example, an instamatch feature that allows shy students to interact with only one person. The app offers several levels to its users, supporting beginners in learning English effectively.

The goal of the application is to provide the best learning experience created by the community that exists in this app that evolves where teachers and students can interact safely, create virtual communities and engage in authentic interactions that accelerate language and cultural fluency acquisition, all while making new friends and contacts in regions where users hope to travel, immigrate, do business, and pursue their dreams.<sup>38</sup>






Figure 2.4 AI Test in Hallo Application





The aims of this research is to discover the types and meaning of slang words in selected Avril Lavigne song lyrics on 'Head Above Water' Album. This writer used decriptive qualitative as method of this research.

Fourth, the research is entitled *The Miss-use of English Slang in Facebook By South Sulawesi Netizen Through Their Posts* by A. Mukhlisa Inayatillah. This research aims to analyze miss-use, the types of slang words, the function and reasons for using slang words in South Sulawesi posts in theirs status posts on Facebook. Literature study is the method that helps the research obtain the theory and information that related to this research. The researcher conducted the data from Facebook which used as material for analysis and the questionnaire given to respondents or the post owners. The subject of this research is South Sulawesi Netizen Through Their Posts on Facebook.

Last, it is from Dinda Ayu Lestari that *English Slang and Abbreviations* used in social media Twitter (A Semantic Analysis). The purpose of this research are to find the meaning of slang and abbreviations and to find the differences between the slang words and abbreviation by twitter users post. The method of this study was qualitative descriptive. The research collected the data from observing the posts of twitter users and supporting the data from the questionnaire. The subject of this research is twitter netizens.

However, The similarities between this study and the previous study mentioned above, which also used descriptive qualitative research as a method. The novelty of this study was in analyzing the types of slang words and the dominant slang words used by the Allan and Burridge theory. The researcher also used Miles and Hubberman theory to analyze the data. Furthermore, the subjects of this study were Indonesian advanced level students in live streaming via the Hallo application.

### **CHAPTER III**

#### RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

# A. Research Design

This research used a descriptive-qualitative method. The method of this study was to analyze the types of slang words and the dominant type of slang words produced by Indonesian students on their live streaming through the Hallo App. Qualitative research is also defined as an effective model that occurs in a natural setting and allows the researcher to develop a level of detail by being deeply involved in the actual experiences. The researcher used this method because it aims to identify and analyze the slang words produced and the types of slang words they used.

# **B.** Research Setting

This research analyzed the slang words produced by Indonesian advanced students during live streaming through Hallo application. The researcher focused on analyzing the type of slang words and determining the dominant types of slang words. The researcher analyzed and noted the slang during live streaming was in four days. The researcher conducted the study in four days from September 26th to September 29th in 2022th.

#### C. Source of the Data

#### 1. Primary Data

Nassaji stated primary data is information gathered by researchers directly from primary sources, such as interviews, surveys, and experiments. Primary data is typically collected from the source where the data originated.<sup>2</sup> The data used in this study are questionnaires and observations. The questionnaire is distributed to Indonesian live streamers, and

observations are gathered from conversations between students while live streaming on the Hallo App.

# 2. Secondary Data

Jhonston states that the key to secondary data analysis is to apply theoretical knowledge and conceptual skills to existing data in order to answer research questions<sup>3</sup> This research's secondary data sources included books, journals, and articles related to this research.

### D. Research Participants

This research participants were Indonesian live streamers who regularly livestream on Hallo app. Purposive random sampling as the research sample in this research. Suharsimi Arikunto claims that if writer had several hundred subjects in the population, they could determine about 25-30% of the total number of subjects. If the population's number of subject members is less than 100, it should be taken entirely.<sup>4</sup>

According to the researcher's observations, less than 100 Indonesian live streamers actively did live streaming on this platform. The researchers found 60 Indonesian live streamers at an advanced level. The participants of this research are Indonesian adults aged approximately 18-26. As a result, this study is referring to a population study.

### E. Data Instruments

The following instruments were used by the researcher to collect data for this study:

# 1. Observation

Observation is a method of gathering data that involves watching behavior, events, or noting physical characteristics in their natural

environment.<sup>5</sup> This observation tool was using record and take notes during a student's live streaming in order to identify slang words.

# 2. Questionnaire

A questionnaire is a series of questions that are asked of individuals in order to gather statistically useful information about a specific topic. Appropriate questions, correct question ordering, correct scaling, or a good questionnaire format can make the survey worthwhile by accurately reflecting the participants' views and opinions.<sup>6</sup>

# F. Data Collection Technique

The data collection techniques used in this study are as follows:

#### 1. Observation

Observation is a method for collecting data in a systematic way. Writers examine people in natural settings or situations with all of their senses.<sup>7</sup> Observation is required to collect data such as the type of slang words in the student's live streaming. The observation was conducting over four days by recording and noting the students' live streaming through the Hallo application.

# 2. Questionnaire

According to Arikunto, a questionnaire is a collection of written questions used to gather information from respondents.<sup>8</sup> The researcher distributed the questionnaire to Indonesian livestreamers and asked them to complete the closed-ended Questionnare via Google form. It enabled the researcher to easily classify and interpret the data, regardless of whether the Indonesian live streamers use slang or not.

In this research, the researcher adapted Leo Syifa's<sup>9</sup> questionaire, which consists of twelve statements, and the score was calculating in Likert Scale.

A Likert scale is a rating scale that is commonly used in questionnaires to assess respondents' attitudes, preferences, and subjective responses to statements. Users are presented with statements and standardized response categories on a scale, such as strongly agree, agree, neither agree nor disagree, disagree, and strongly disagree. The Likert scale is a composite measure created by adding the sum of responses to various Likert items. <sup>10</sup>

# G. Data Analysis Technique

The researcher analyzed the data based on the theory of Miles and Huberman<sup>11</sup>, in three steps:

# 1. Data Reduction

According to Miles and Huberman, data reduction is the process of selecting, focusing, simplifying, abstracting, and modifying data found in written or transcribed field records.<sup>12</sup>

The result of this data based on questionnaire and slang words discovered by writer. The main focused on this research was identifying

# 2. Data Display

Miles and Huberman states data display is a structured and simplified collection of information that allows for the drawing of conclusions and actions<sup>13</sup>. The data presented by the researcher in the form of a brief description, a table, and a chart that illustrated the data analysis. In order to demonstrate the data, the researcher used percentage formula.

### 3. Conclusion

The conclusion is the outcome of data analysis that answers the research problem. The researcher demonstated the findings of their analysis and their solution to the problem formulation in the form of descriptive data. The data submitted is summarized in general.

# H. Validity of the data

The researcher validated the data in this research by using triangulation. Sugiyono defined triangulation as data collection techniques that combine various data collection techniques and existing data sources. <sup>14</sup> On the other hand, Moleong, as cited in Wardayani, defines triangulation as a technique for determining the validity of data by using other data. <sup>15</sup>

In addition, the researcher chose theoretical triangulation in this study. Denzin defined triangulation as a technique for determining the validity of data via source triangulation, methodological triangulation, investigator triangulation, and theoretical triangulation. The researcher used theoretical triangulation to attempt to enhance the data's results by comparing the data to the presented theory.

#### I. Research Procedures

In this study, the researcher used observation and questionnare to collecting the data.

- 1. Join and Hop-on the Indonesian Live streaming
- 2. Distribut the Quetionnare that the researcher has prepared.
- 3. While the students are live streaming, the researcher will listen, record their screen and take notes on the slang words they produce.
- 4. Classifying the various types of slang words produced by students.
- 5. Translating each slang words produced by students using two slang dictionary books such as Dictionary of American Slang and Colloquial Expression, The Routledge of Modern American Slang and Uncoventional English, and Online Urban Dictionary.
- 6. Analyzing the questionnare and the slang words in order to discover the dominant slang.
- 7. Concluding the result of the data.

#### **CHAPTER IV**

#### FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

The researcher presented the results of the findings and the discussion in this chapter based on the research questions. The findings was made regarding the type and dominant type of slang words produced by Indonesian advance level students in live streaming through Hallo App.

# A. Findings

The research findings concerned the observation of slang word produced by students and the scoring item of the students' questionnaire. The researcher presented the data that had analyzed in the slang fields in this section.

#### 1. Observation

According to the researcher's observations, 29 slang words had discovered through students' live streaming via the Hallo application. Based on Allan and Burridge's theory, the researcher discovered five types of slang words during live streaming: There were Fresh and Creative (A), Flippant (B), Imitative (C), Acronym (D), and Clipping (E).



The table above displayed the slang words spoken and written by the students during live streaming. The written forms were discovered in the students' live streaming title. The symbols "~" in the last words of the sentence represented the written form of the slang words discovered by the researcher.

#### 2. Questionnaire

The questionnaire was collected from Indonesian advanced level students who frequently do live streaming. There were total of 12 statements which adapted from Leo syifa's questionnaire.

The data had calculated using the percentage formula after the researcher obtained it from the respondents. The researcher used charts to demonstrate the results of each statement to explain the data. The charts below showed the total percentage of each statement



**Chart 4.1: Slang words is important** 

According to the chart 4.1, 45 students with a percentage score of 75% agreed, and nine students with a percentage score of 15% strongly agreed with the first statement. Meanwhile, 5 students with percentage score of 8.3% responded disagree and 1 students with percentage score 1,7% chose strongly disagree. It means the majority of the students agreed that English slang is important.




Chart 4.2: I often use slang words

Chart 4.2 demonstrated 37 students, or approximately 61.7%, agreed, while 18.3% strongly agreed. Meanwhile, 20% of students disagree. The majority of students agree that they frequently use slang words in daily informal communication.

Chart 4.3: I prefer to use slang words to communicate with family, friends, classmate, others






Chart 4.3 showed 46.7% of students agreed, while 16.7% strongly agreed. Then, 33.3% of students disagreed, and 3.3% strongly disagreed. It can be concluded that nearly all of the students agreed on the use of slang words with their close ones.

Based on the chart 4.4, 55% of students agree, with 18.3% strongly agree. In contrast, 25% of students disagree and one students strongly disagree with the statement. The data that have a function to initiate relax conversation are slang words such as kinda, wanna, gonna, etc. In conclusion, students tend to use slang words to initiate relaxed conversations in order to smooth conversations in informal situations.

Chart 4.5: I constantly use slang words to express my thoughts



. Chart 4.5 showed that 43,3% students answered agree, 20% answered strongly agree. Then, 35% student disagree while 1,7% students answered strongly disagree. The researcher found the data that

has a function to express thoughts are slang words such as wassup, awesome, cool, etc. It can be concluded that almost all Students usually use slang word to express the impression. It means when the students uses a slang word, the students wants someone to remember and feels impressed about their conversation.

According to Chart 4.6, 30 students or approximately 50%, agreed, while 18.3% strongly agreed. Meanwhile, 25% of students disagreed and 6,7% students strongly disagree. The researcher found the data that has a function to express thoughts are slang words such as damn. It means The majority of students agreed that they used slang words to revealed anger.





Chart 4.7: I use slang words to maintain my close relationship

Based on Chart 4.7, 36 students or approximately 60%, agreed, while 11.7% strongly agreed. Meanwhile, 23,3% of students disagreed and


5% students strongly disagree. Slang words such as bro, darling, fellas and guys were discovered by the researcher to have a function in maintaining close relationships. It means that the majority of students agreed on using slang words to address another person in order to maintain their close relationship. A close friend prefers an informal address to a formal one.

Chart 4.8: I always use slang words to reduce social distance and make conversation with stangers more comfortable



As shown in chart 4.8, 15% of students strongly agreed, while 48.3% agreed. Meanwhile, 31.7% of students disagreed and 5% strongly disagreed. The researcher discovered that slang words like GM and chit-chat have a function in reducing social distance. As a result, students frequently use this slang to connect social gaps and having conversations with strangers more comfortable.

Chart 4.9: I use slang words to mock other people to express how i feel about them



45% of students agreed, while 8.3% strongly agreed, according to Graph 4.9. In comparison, 23.3% of students strongly disagreed or strongly disagreed with the statement. The researcher discovered data with the function of mocking other people, slang words such as fucking different, sleepy cat, lol, and so on. Finally, the majority of students agreed that in some situations, they use slang to express their dislike for other people's feelings by mocking them.

Chart 4.10: The slang word will be widely used in the future




Chart 4.10 presented that 63% of students answered agree, 21% of students answered strongly agree, and 11,7% of them answered disagree and 3,3% students strongly disagree. It can be concluded that almost all students agreed that English slang will be widely used in the future.

Chart 4.11: Slang words are an unnecessary language



Chart 4.12: I frequently use proper names as slang words




Chart 4.12 revealed 50% of students answered agree, 8,3% answered strongly disagree. Meanwhile, 38,3% students answered disagree and 3,3% students responded strongly disagree. It means that the students have often used proper names as a slang word.

Overall, the charts showed the majority of the students agreed that slang words is important and they frequently used it. In addition, the students also agree from several statements that may contained the function of slang words that represented the types of slang words that had found.

After obtaining the percentage of the charts above, the researcher displayed the slang into a table to simplified the slang based on the frequency.

As shown above, the imitative type was the most frequently used in slang words among the Indonesian Advance level students during live streaming through Hallo application. This type of slang had function initiate relax conversation and express thoughts. Thus, the researcher assumed that they had enjoyable conversations in informal way. Students who had close relationships with their friend had a tendency to use specific words to made the conversation more relaxed and comfortable. It was supported by the appearance of slang words classified as to initiate relax conversation and expressing their thoughts freely.

#### **B.** Discussion

# 1. Types of Slang Words

The researcher stated in the previous chapter that slang words had classified into five types based on Allan and Burridge's theory: Fresh and Creative (A), Flippant (B), Imitative (C), Acronym (D), and Clipping (E).

# a. Fresh and Creative (A)

According to Allan and Burridge in Prihandoko, fresh and creative means that slang has completely new vocabulary, informal variety, cleverness, imagination, and it can also be current words.<sup>1</sup>

The table above showed the fresh and creative types of slang words. In a code A1, there is a live streamers who said "**Yeah**, like a glass or something?". the word "**Yeah**" means yes in a casual way. This statement demonstrated that the live streamer and his friend played a riddle and trying to confirm a glass as an answer.

Then, the Code A2 and code A3 were "Hello, **Guys**!" and "Your voice too low my **darling**". The word "**Guys**" means to call a group of people. The live streamers greeted the viewers in a friendly manner. Whereas, The "**Darling**" means a name used by people who love each other and people who are friendly. The live streamers reminded her friends that her voice is way too low in a friendly way.

Lastly, the statement "Hi **Fellas** it's been a while" was code A4. The word "**Fellas**" refers to a group of men or fellows. This indicated that the live streamer would like to greet her male friends.

According to Allan and Burridge's theory, the slang words yeah, darling, guys and fellas are inculcating into the fresh and creative type because both of them are a current word or a new vocabulary that is frequently used among young people. <sup>2</sup>

In sociolinguistics, slang words appeared as new vocabulary as a result of societal behaviors. Furthermore, Muhartoyo and Wijawa stated that slang is a component of language variation due to the need

to adapt to new or different aspects of society, as well as a factor of social prestige.<sup>3</sup>

# b. Flippant (B)

The key to classifying slang words as flippant is when the slang form consists of more than two words and has no relationship to the denotative meaning.<sup>4</sup>

In a code B1, the slang word "Fucking different" means not the same each other. The live streamers said " That's a fucking different, right?". This statement implied that her university major is unrelated to her current job.

The phrase **fucking different** was made up of two words: fucking and different. Each of the two words had a different meaning on its own, but when they combined into one phrase or more, the meaning is different from the original words.

The code B2, "**Sleepy Cat**" means someone who is constantly tired, dozing off at the wrong times. The researcher found this slang on the topic of the indonesian live streaming. This indicated that the live streamers feel exhausting and sleepy in wrong moments.

Then, the code B3 was the term "Sleepless Nite". It was an abbreviation for "Sleepless Night" which refers to a night when a person is unable to sleep. This indicated that the live streamers may be suffering from insomnia, making it difficult for him to sleep.

Last, the code B4 "I made this livestream just for **killing my time**". The word "**Killing my time**" " is derived from the phrase "**Killing time**," which means to do something to keep the person busy while waiting for something else to happen. The live streamers informed her friends that she was doing live streaming to keep herself busy and avoid boredom.

The slang terms above was the flippant types because it composed of two or more words that were not relating in any way to the denotative meaning of the word.

Allan and Burridge theory stated slang is the use of informal words and expressions that are not considered standard in a given language but may be considered more acceptable when used socially and has long been a source of contention among generations, nations, and social classes.<sup>5</sup>

#### c. Imitative (C)

Imitative refers to a slang term that replicated a Standard English word. It combined two words to form a new word.

The code C1 "Gonna" is derived from phrase "Going To" which has the same meaning as 'will'. The live streamers said "I'm gonna protect my streak". The streak was a chart that showed how many people used the Hallo App in order to got the premium version. The live streams informed viewers that he would frequently do live streaming via the Hallo app to protect his streak.

The code C2 "**Kinda**" is derived from phrase "**Kinda of**" The word had similar meaning with "Sort of" word. Both mean slightly or somewhat. The live streamer asked "Is it kayak **kinda** worth like worthy at all?" to her friend. The live streamers asked her friends another english learning platform.

The code C3 "I **gotta** go right now". The slang "**Gotta**" is derived from "Got to". This sentence is intended that the live streamers was going to ended the live streaming.

The code C4 demonstated "**Damn**, my back". The slang term "Damn" is considered to be an imitative. The meaning of the slang words was to express frustation. This sentence is intended that the live streamers expressed her frustation because how hurt her back was.

The code C5 showed "Yo wassup Ali". The slang terms "Wassup" is derived from the phrase "What's up". The meaning of this slang to said greeting in informal way. The live streamer was greeting the person who came to her live streaming.

"That's **awesome**" and "That's **cool**" were the code C6 and C7. Both of the slang words has the same meaning. The meaning of the slang were to express impression. The sentence indicated that the live streamers feel impressed to her friends ability.

The sentence in code C8 "I'm **tryna** fix the problem". The slang words "**Tryna**" is formed by two words that were "Try to". The sentence explained the live streamers was going to fix his network due the fact his voice was lagging.

The code C9 "I wanna talk in English". The slang terms "wanna" is derived from "want to". The live streamers explained to her friends that she wanted to use English instead of her native language during live streaming.

"fruitless~" is the code C10. "Fruitless" was stands for fruit and less which means Unproductive of success. It means the live streamers explained she through her day unproductively during live streaming.

Last, "Chit-chat for short #unusualls" was the code C11. The bold word was slang that is considered as imitative type. The slang words "Chit-chat" means small talk or gossiping. The live streamers invited her viewers in order to have small talk for several minutes.

All of the data presented above were examples of imitative slang words. Refers to prihandoko imitative, which is a slang language that imitates Standard English (SE); using SE words in different contexts or combining two different words<sup>6</sup>

It was related to sociolinguistics, such as Wardaugh's theory. One example he gave is that social structure can influence or determine linguistic structure and/or behavior.<sup>7</sup>

The imitative type, such as the word "want to," derives from the standard word structure (want + to). It was discovered that social structure have an impact on linguistic structure.

# d. Acronym (d)

An acronym is a word that is composed of the first letters of several words.

The code D1 "**lol~**" was an acronym type from Laughing out Loud. This slang had found in the topic of live streaming. The live streamers told his embarassing story to the viewers through live streaming.

"LS only for 10 minutes~" is the code D2. The slang was type of acronym that refers to the word Live Streaming. The researcher

found the slang in topic of live streaming. The sentence explained the live streamers make the live streaming for a while.

Then, "omg~" is the code D3. The slang was type of acronym that refers to the word Oh My God. The researcher found the slang as a topic through live streaming. It indicated that something is surprising. The live streaming felt suprise with the news that she heard from her friends.

"so far to catch **u**~" is the code D4 that is considered as type of acronym. The bold word is derived from the word You. The slang found in the topic of live streaming. Through the live streaming, The live streamer revealed that she has problem on her love story.

The code D5 is "idk~". The slang wass type of acronym. The data is constructed by the word I Don't Know. The live streamers stated that he used the words because he couldn't decide on a topic.

Last, "G.M~" was the code D6. The slang terms "GM" was an abbreviation of the phrase Good Morning. The live streamers expressed a good wishes during the morning to her viewers.

According to the theory of Umam and Purnianda, acronyms are formed by combining the initial sounds (or letters) of the words of a phrase. The acronym was originally a changing phrase into a word.<sup>8</sup>

Based on Eble as cited in Holmes, Slang is ever changing the colloquial words and phrases that speakers use to establish or rainforce social identity or cohesiveness within a group or with a trend and fashion in society at large.<sup>9</sup>

In addition, acronym is form of a phrase that turn into initial from each letter for uttering a new word.

Clipping type words are shortened versions of longer words with the same meaning.

First, "What are you waiting for **bro**?" was the code E1. The bold words is considered as type of clipping. The word "**Bro**" is derived from the word "Brother" which means a male siblings or a male comrade. The live streamers tried to convice his viewers to talked to him during live streaming.

The code E2 was "I feel a little bit dizzy **cause** of the train". The slang term "**Cause**" was short form of the word "Because". The sentence implied that the live streamers are dizzy because it was her first time traveling in a train.

"before **joggin'~**" was the code E3. The bold words is short form of the word "Jogging" which means running slowly as part of an exercise routine. The researcher discovered the data from the topic of the live streaming. The live streamer explained that she does a live stream before her daily exercise.

Then, "**jammin** with sad songs~" was the code D4. The slang is classified as type of clipping. The researcher discovered the data from the topic of the live streaming. The slang words "**jammin**" was short form of the word "Jamming". The live streamers explained that she did the live streaming while listening to sad songs.

Regarding to Holmes, even though the clipping has both negative and positive meanings, it aims to make sentences shorter, faster, and easier to say.<sup>10</sup>

According to the above theory, the discovery of this part is being incorporated into slang words. The type is clipping type. All of them are variations on the standard word, but they all have the same meaning.

## 2. Dominant types of Slang Words

The researcher presented the percentage of performing slang words by Indonesian advanced level students in live streaming via the Hallo app in this section. The percentages used to demonstrate the most popular type of slang words produced by students. The percentage formula was chosen by the researcher.

From the data collected, the researcher found 29 data slang words, 50 frequencies of slang words had gotten, and five types of slang words. The table above displayed the percentage result of slang word usage through live streaming. Among the types, imitative is the highest slang found with 34%. Secondly fresh and

creative at 24%. It followed by acronym at 22%. Then, clipping with 12%. Last, flippant had a score of 8%. Hence, the dominant type of slang word based on the frequency of its use is the imitative type.

### **CHAPTER V**

### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

### A. Conclusion

Based on the findings and discussion, the researcher answered the research questions concerning the type and dominant type of slang words produced by Indonesian Advanced Level Students in Live Streaming through the Hallo Application. The researcher formed the following conclusions from the two findings:

- 1. From 29 slang, The researcher classified the types of slang words into 11 imitative, 6 acronyms, 4 fresh and creative, 4 flippant, and 4 clipping. Each of the slang words had a different frequency of usage.
- 2. The dominant type of slang words produced by Indonesian Advanced Level Students in Live Streaming through the Hallo Application is the imitative type had a score of 34% as the highest slang found. It followed by the fresh and creative with a score of 24%. Then, the acronym type with score of 22%. After that, the clipping type with score of 12%. Last, the flippant type with score of 8%.

### **B.** Suggestion

In this section, the researcher aims to provide a significant suggestion.

#### 1. Lecturers

The researcher hopes the lecturers can apply slang words during teaching in order to create enjoyable learning for students to increase their new vocabulary.

### 2. Students

The researcher suggests students to use slang words carefully and with whom they will use them in the future. Additionally, there are some inappropriate slang words.

### 3. Other writers

This research can be reference to other writers who are interested in conducting similar research. Hopefully, future writers will expand on this study by conducting another study of slang words in social media.
